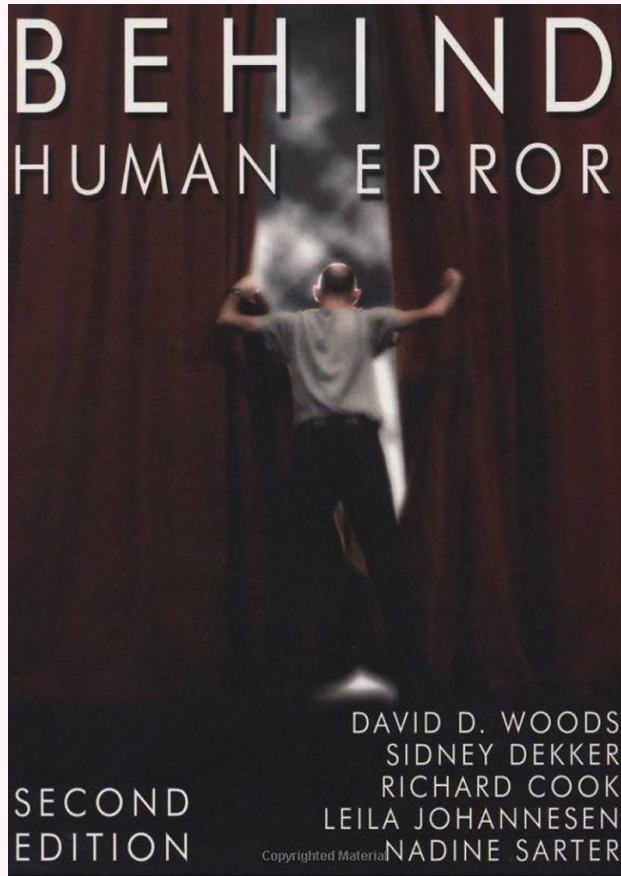

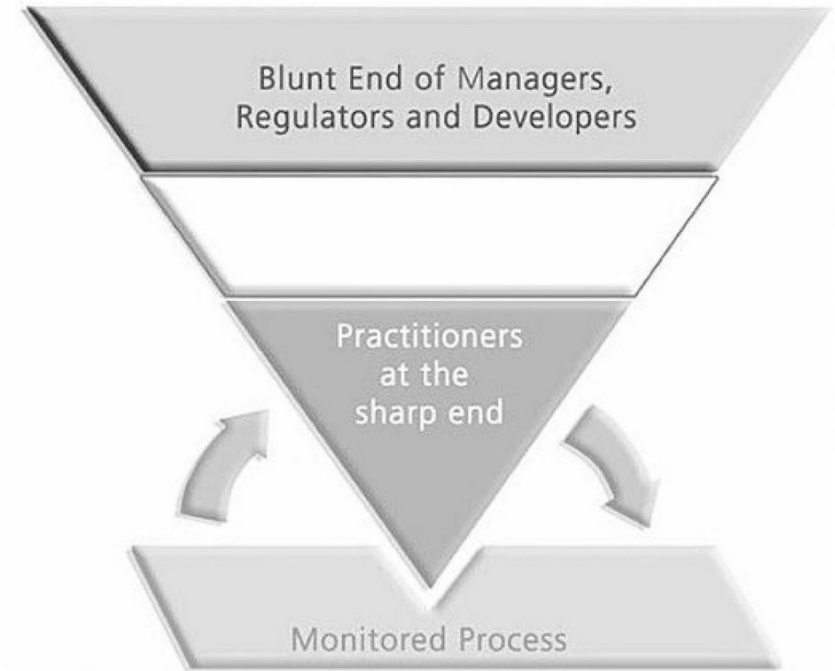
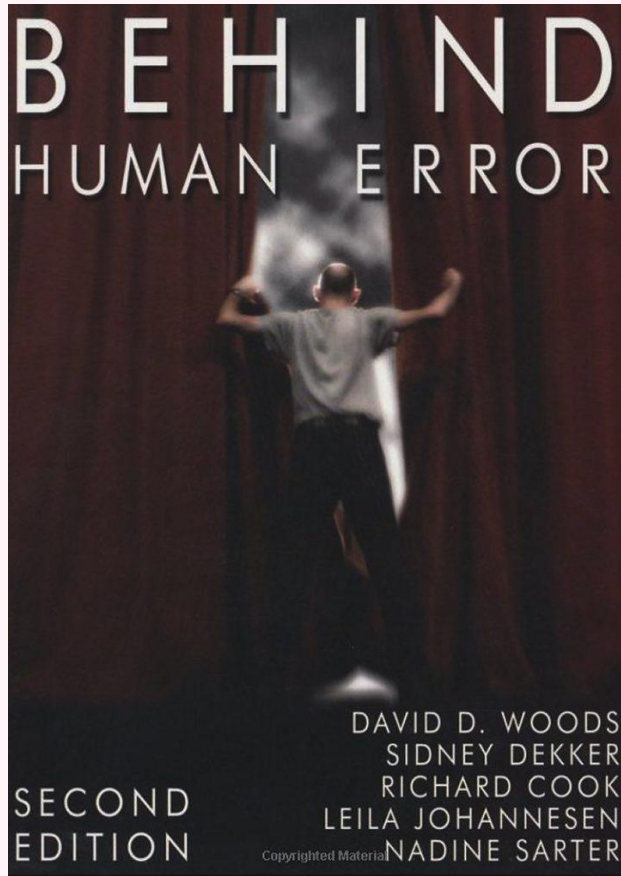


Figure 1.1 The sharp and blunt ends of a complex system

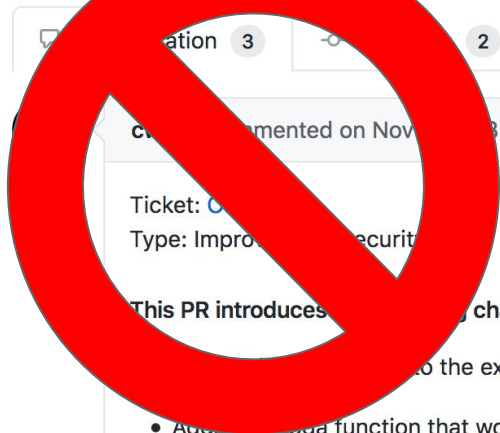

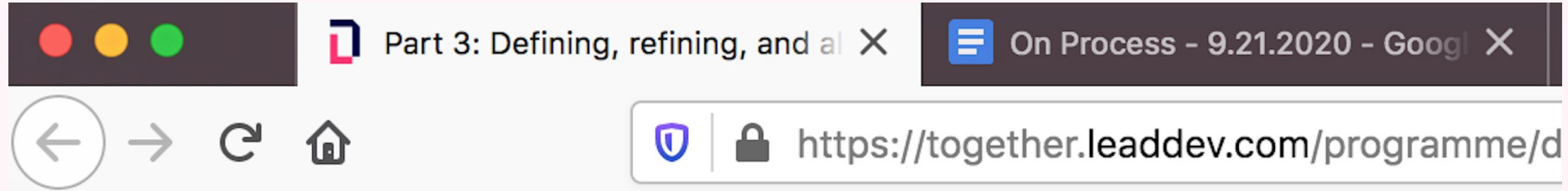

relationship that features mutual respect and care provides the foundation for more expansive interfaith activity.

Reality is both relational and dialogical. In order to describe ourselves, we must give reference to others.¹⁴ These Others are not only people, but non-human animals, places, inanimate objects, even the Earth itself. Through relationships we become who we are, as they are felt internally, changing our very existence. The dialogical character of our existence, then, goes deeper than mere talk to the way we share space, interact with, and respond to the presence of others more primally. Relationships are a “given”, and while they cannot be negated, they can be devalued.¹⁵ Positive relationships give us hope, meaning, and courage.

This explication of our relational reality stands in contrast to an old yet pervasive view of the university and humanity, associated with Democritus and Isaac Newton¹⁶. In this view, while
